Agenda item 4a: Mayor's Awards

Awards are to be presented by the outgoing Mayor, Cllr Jan Morter, as follows:

Please note that we print details as supplied by the recipients.

Awarded to Emma Beacham for services to the community as the founder of Abingdon More In Common Group.

Inspired by the passion of the late British MP, Jo Cox, More in Common aims to bring communities together to celebrate what unites them. The Abingdon More in Common group focuses on the actions we can take at a local level to connect our community and reduce isolation. Emma started the group as a tribute to her friend Jo and has had strong support from others in the community who felt that they wanted to work towards the same aim. With Host Abingdon the group started a monthly Communi-tea Drop-in on the second Saturday of the month at St Ethelwold's House, which has been very worthwhile in connecting people- both those new to Abingdon, and anyone who lives in the town and would like to meet other people. Last June, in conjunction with three other local community groups More in Common organised a "Great Get Together" bring and share lunch, which was great fun- and will take place again this year on the 24th June at St Ethelwold's House - please come along! The group plans to organise more events, including a photography exhibition celebrating the people of Abingdon, and a Human Library.

Awarded to Anne Smart for services to the community, as a volunteer for the Abingdon Cuts Plastic Group / Abingdon Carbon Cutters.

Anne retired from Social Work nearly 2 years ago, and since then has become an active member of Abingdon Carbon Cutters, which is a Community Action Group. Carbon Cutters raise awareness about environmental issues in the town, for example on air quality and sustainable housing, as well as promoting growing and cooking local food.

Her involvement is in the Abingdon Cuts Plastic sub-group of Carbon Cutters. Their aim is to involve the whole town in doing its best to reduce the harm caused by plastic pollution. Many people and businesses are already on board with this and have made changes, by encouraging individuals, organisations and retailers to find

alternatives to single-use plastic wherever possible, for example in packaging, coffee cups and straws, and using reusable drinking water bottles.

They started their campaign in January and conducted a plastics survey of cafes in February. In April they had a week's launch in the Community Free Space, to which over 160 people visited.

They now have the Refill initiative in Abingdon, and an outlet for SESI refillable detergents; both great for reducing the need to buy a new plastic bottle.

The groups plans, going forward, are to continue to find ways to encourage further reduction in plastics use, and increased recycling, also litter-picking. They already have the support of some Councillors and businesses and have plans to involve local schools.

Anne said she is honoured to be receiving the award but wanted to stress that the Plastics group is made up of several people who are giving their time and energy to the campaign, and members of Carbon Cutters who have been working for over 10 years for the improvement of Abingdon's environment.

Awarded to Shirley Thompson for services to the community, as a volunteer with the Abingdon Child Contact Centre.

The Abingdon Child Contact Centre was started 20 years ago and aims to help children who parents are separated. Where there is no alternative it offers a neutral and comfortable place where children can enjoy contact with the parent who does not live with them.

The Centre offers a large sitting/play area with toys and games for all ages and there is space for quiet conversation. It is a safe, comfortable and neutral ground for children and parent to relax and enjoy each other's company. Tea, coffee and soft drinks are available to buy.

The Centre is part of the National Association of Child Contact Centres and is run by local volunteers. The Abingdon Contact Centre is held in the church hall at the rear of the Baptist Church in Ock Street.

Shirley has been involved with the Centre as a volunteer for 20 years, and as the coordinator for the past six years.
