## Planning panel Monday 28 March 2022 Applications considered

### P22/V0558/HH

**Address:** 29 Tatham Road, OX14 1QB  
**Deadline for comments:** 8 April 2022  
**Description:** Single storey rear extensions with double storey side extension and front porch.  
**Requested by:** Cllr Birks  
**Reason:** There is not enough information regarding the hedge they wish to remove nor on the fence they wish to replace it with.  
**28 March 2022:** The town council recommends rejection of this application as insufficient information has been provided to enable the application to be determined. The town council also notes that the proposed solid fence would not be in keeping with the rest of the road, which would contravene Core Policy 37(i), (ii) and (viii) of the Vale of White Horse District Council Local Plan 2031.

### P22/V0622/DIS

**Address:** Aldi Stores Limited Wootton Road Abingdon-on-Thames  
**Deadline for comments:** No deadline given  
**Description:** Discharge of condition 4 (Biodiversity Offsetting Scheme) on planning application P21/V0024/FUL. (The erection of a Class E discount foodstore with associated access, parking and servicing areas, landscaping, and associated works.)  
**Requested by:** Cllr Birks  
**Reason:** There is a contradiction between the committee report and the plans. Cyclists are not given priority on the plans. The planned access could lead to confusion as it appears both the traffic leaving the site and cyclists in both directions are required to give way, whilst the cycle path is not clearly defined as it crosses the entrance  
**28 March 2022:** It is not possible to comment on this application. Cllr Birks would be advised to contact the planning authority directly with his concerns.
