Neighbourhood Plan update

The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group met with residents at the open evening in March. We explained the background to the neighbourhood plan, why it matters for the future of Abingdon and next steps to complete it in time for a referendum.

The evening introduced preliminary suggestions made in three key areas - Green Spaces, the Town Centre and the different Neighbourhoods - and discussed the heart of our town, traffic problems, the rich built heritage and the possibility of a recreational and cultural riverside hub on the river. The team emphasised that the neighbourhood plan is for all the town, not just the centre.

The steering group will work with the Vale of White Horse District Council as it develops its Central Abingdon Regeneration Framework, identifying options for improving buildings, land and transport routes and including proposals for the Charter, Abbey House and the Upper Reaches Hotel.

C Abingdon Green Forum



The Green Forum was formed as part of the Town Council's pledge to take positive action to counter climate change. Its purpose is to promote and initiate changes that will help towards carbon neutrality within the town, reduce waste, promote the general well-being of our residents, and improve local biodiversity, i.e. trees, plants, and wildlife.

The Green Forum Steering Group is a collaboration of local voluntary groups including Carbon Cutters and One Planet Abingdon/Climate Emergency Centre, which are active in trying to improve the town's environment. We all need to do more to reduce the effects of the climate and ecological emergencies and time is running out.

The Green Forum invites views and ideas from all Abingdon residents and these will be included as part of the Neighbourhood Plan.

There is a theme each quarter, with events and meetings concentrating on a particular topic. We started with Active Travel and Sustainable Transport, which culminated in a market stall on 26 March 2022. This was well attended by local people who shared their views on school streets, and bus routes and shared suggestions for improvements to walking & cycle routes.

The winners of our school competition to design a Hi-Viz backpack cover for promoting cycling were announced at the event alongside information on car sharing and car clubs.

Biodiversity is the second theme for the next quarter of 2022: this will take place on the 2 June 2022, as part of the town's Platinum Jubilee celebrations. There will be a stall for the promotion of local clubs and societies.

We have invited George McGavin, the TV presenter and expert on insects, to the event, who will be conducting guided walks to the wildflower meadow. We will also be celebrating local tree planting.

I have enjoyed being Mayor of Abingdon for the last year. It has been a privilege to represent the town.

It hasn't been the usual Mayoral year because of the impact of the pandemic. Events have been reduced and limited in the capacity of the people involved. I hope the next Mayor's year will be busier and back to normal.

It has been a great pleasure to be involved in my two charities. DAMASCUS does outreach work with disenfranchised young people who do not usually have interactions with other organisations.

I have seen the positive impact it has had on these young people.

My other charity is Yellow Submarine, which works with young people with learning difficulties, including autism. They work with young people in community settings to build their social skills, confidence, independence, and ultimately their employability, thus empowering them.

I have supported inclusion and environmental issues in Abingdon. I am proud to be the first Green Party Mayor and the first LGBTQ+ Mayor in Abingdon.

I have listened to young LGBTQ+ people in Abingdon and the feedback has been positive, so I have hopefully been a positive role model. I have been involved in Abingdon environmental groups and will continue to do so in the future.

Friends of Abingdon Civic Society

The Friends of Abingdon have organised, with local societies and individuals, a series of guided walks which will take place on Friday 3 June. There will be the opportunity to join informative guides from local groups such as the Abingdon Area Archaeology and History Society, the Naturalist's Society, the Friends of Abingdon and One Planet Abingdon, looking at different aspects of the town.

There will also be self-guided walks available, including a new 'Royal Associations' walk which will give you the opportunity, at your leisure, to explore some of the fascinating history of Abingdon's royal connections.

Walks will start from our stall at Rye Farm Meadow – guided walks at 10.30am and 2.30pm (book in from 10am on the day), self-guided walks at any time.

ATOM Festival joins the Jubilee!

This year's ATOM Festival is joining forces with the Platinum Jubilee celebrations at Rye Farm Meadow. Kicking off with a Jubilee special lecture at the Unicorn Theatre on Wednesday 1 June, Abingdon's <u>Professor Frank Close</u> will review how 70 years of the Queen's reign have seen significant changes in science, many involving local science institutions. The <u>Family Science Fair</u> will take place on Friday 3 June from 11am to 3pm, bringing hands-on science activities, experiments and fun for all ages.

Other events in June include a look at the life and times of <u>Lonesome George</u>, the last Galapagos Giant Tortoise, an introduction to spectrometry and a look at nano-technology, science comedian Dr Sam Gregson back to entertain family audiences with his '<u>Hunting the Higgs</u>' event, and we have <u>hedgehogs</u>. There's free hands-on science in the Market Place on Saturday 11 June and at the Amey Theatre with <u>Dr Helen Czerski</u> on Friday 17 June.
