The planning panel is established in the town council's standing orders and scheme of delegation under the Town Infrastructure Committee as follows (para (iii)(2)):

'The Council is consulted by the district council in relation to all planning applications registered in Abingdon. In order to exercise this power in an efficient, effective and focused manner the Council will appoint a panel of three members* which will meet every three weeks to consider planning applications. The panel will have authority to consider and comment on any plans which have been registered on the District Council's website and which any member of the council has requested the panel to consider by way of a "call-in" mechanism. Authority is delegated to the Town Clerk to offer no objection to any application which has not been called-in by members. The Committee will agree a detailed scheme to regulate this procedure which will include deadlines ahead of meetings for the call-in mechanism to be exercised.'
