Reply sent 10.8.23: The town council objects to this application as the retention of

marguees at the site would be out of keeping with the

conservation area and may cause traffic disruption, given the narrow road next to the property and the levels of parking there already. The additional users of the business, in particular the extra traffic and parked vehicles, are causing a detrimental impact

on neighbouring properties and may be a hazard. The town council request that the district council Environmental Health team monitors the situation during busy periods, i.e. in the evenings of pub opening. The application would contravene Core Policy 37(i)(ii) and (iv) of the Vale of White Horse District Council Local

Plan 2031.

The town council will ask the County Councillor for the area to request information about highways issues around the property.
