6.3 The calculation of the score to grant applied for offers a comparison of the applications received in terms of the town council's aims and objectives and the extent to which each applicant addresses them. The grant determination form for each application provides further information on this. A higher score suggests that the grant offers better value for money than a lower scoring application. For comparison, grants awarded in 2023-24 to date have had scores between 0.13 and 2.67, with six out of ten grants awarded scoring above 2. The lowest score for a successful application was 0.13. One organisation given a partial award (12.5% of the amount requested) scored 0.15.

7. Climate change/green implications

7.1 As part of the grant scoring process the green implications of each application are considered and are reflected in the final scorings.

- 8.1 The budget for community grants for 2023-24 is £30,000 (406/4886), of which £24,615 has been awarded this year. Councillors are advised that any unspent element of the budget at the end of the civic year shall be transferred to the general fund and will not be available to fund any further community grants.
