National Planning Consultations

Please note that ONH Planning for Good have forwarded some national planning consultations with deadlines coming up shortly:

1. Speeding up build out – 7th July

This explains the reasons why building homes after consent has been obtained can often take too long. It identifies problems stem as much from how the housing development market is structured and operates than from planning policy constraints. It tackles the issues of land banking and price-base absorption rates.

2. Reforming site thresholds $-\frac{9^{th}}{July}$

Part of the Government's small sites strategy by redefining SME sites into 'minor' (<10 homes or < 0.5 Ha) and 'medium' (10 - 49 homes or < 1 Ha) housing development. Sites of 50+ (or > 1Ha) are then deemed major housing development. It also defines 'very small sites' of < 0.1 Ha that it proposes to address in the new National Development Management Policy, National Model Design Code and 'Brownfield Passport' regimes.
