### 2. Outgoing Mayor's speech including Mayor's Awards

3. **Election of Mayor**

To receive nominations for the position of Mayor for the civic year 2026-27 and to elect the Mayor.

The newly elected Mayor will:

- (i) Receive the Mayoral robes and chain of office.
- (ii) Make and sign the Statutory Declaration of Office.
- (iii) Make a short speech and announce their Escorts for the year.
- (iv) The Mayor’s Escorts will receive Mayor’s Escort badges.

4. **Election of Deputy Mayor**

To receive nominations for the position of Deputy Mayor for the civic year 2026-27 and to elect the Deputy Mayor.

The Deputy Mayor will then:

- (i) Receive their badge of office.
- (ii) Make and sign the Statutory Declaration of Office.
- (iii) Make a short speech and announce their Escort for the year.
- (iv) The Deputy Mayor’s Escort will receive the Deputy Mayor’s Escort badge.

A vote of thanks will be made to the retiring Mayor, Cllr Rawda Jehanli. The retiring Mayor will receive a Past Mayor's badge from the incoming Mayor.
